# FEDIAF's 2022 Congress and Annual General Meeting

**On 22 and 23 June 2022**, FEDIAF's Congress and Annual General Meeting will take place in Brussels at the Hotel Steigenberger Wiltcher's. On Wednesday 22 June, the 2022 **FEDIAF Congress will be open to the public**. The event will celebrate FEDIAF's 50th Anniversary, by showcasing the year's highlights and revealing the new FEDIAF video explainer. The programme will include a presentation of a **research study on "The Future of Pet ownership"** to highlight how millennials are overtaking the ageing baby boomers as the biggest pet-owning generation and also a **panel discussion** involving high-level speakers focusing **on the future availability of raw materials.** 

## FEDIAF Signed the EU Code of Conduct

In January, FEDIAF signed the Code of Conduct. This Code reflects the goals of the 2020 Farm to Fork Strategy and the European Green Deal, as well as global sustainability targets, such as the UN sustainable development goals.

The decision to sign this document was firstly conceived by the members of the FEDIAF Environmental Sustainability Working Group. By signing the Code, **FEDIAF will seek to support and contribute to the aspirational objectives that it sets out**, where applicable to the pet food sector. Moreover, it subscribes to the Code's obligations, such as disseminating and promoting it amongst its members to encourage more sustainable practices and explore the possibility of developing sector-specific tools and resources. Finally, **FEDIAF will also provide an annual report of its activities as well as pursue dialogue with stakeholders and policy-makers.**

Advisory Group on the Food Chain and Animal

2022, **FEDIAF** In January contributed to the Commission Public Consultation to revise the EU legislation on animal welfare. This initiative explored several options for addressing the shortcomings in the recent evaluation of the EU legislation on animal welfare. The consultation lasted from 15 October 2021 to 21 January 2022 and included а short questionnaire. This short questionnaire focused on animal welfare at the farm level but also included the transportation of cats and commercial dogs for purposes. FEDIAF's input centred on the inclusion of cats and dogs welfare regarding transport for commercial purposes.

On February and March, FEDIAF participated in the Commission's Ad hoc meetings of the Advisory Group on the Food Chain and Animal and Plant Health. This group has been established to consult stakeholders in an open and transparent way at the European level during the preparation, revision and evaluation of EU food legislation. It provides the European Commission with stakeholders' views on food safety policy, and specifically on issues related to food and feed safety, human nutrition in relation to food legislation, food and feed labelling and presentation, animal health and welfare, and matters related to plant health.

FEDIAF Position Paper on the Revision of the Renewable Energy Directive

In a position paper published in February, FEDIAF welcomed the ambitious climate package and express its support towards the mainstreaming of renewable across all economic energy sectors. This choice was justified by the several commitments already made by the organisation's members in this field. Moreover, the paper highlights that as the EU takes bold steps towards decarbonizing transport,

it is important to ensure coherence with established policies such as the circular economy and food and feed security.



This is particularly relevant when valuable by-products are used for biofuels, diverting raw materials from sectors that have for decades used them in line with the waste hierarchy. More specifically, the paper made three main claims. First, it emphasised that **essential pet food materials**, such as Category 3 animal by-products, **should not be diverted towards biofuels**. Second, the paper **listed and identified social and environmental sustainability issues** behind using category 3 animal fats in biofuels. Finally, it stated that **renewable energy legislation should regulate the eligibility of feedstock based on broader sustainability concerns.**
